Black Cherry	<i>Prunus serotina</i> . Moist well drained soils. Tall, straight trees. Bird friendly.	◐	12-18"	\$8.00	\$13.00	\$27.00
Black Maple	<i>Acer nigrum</i> . Moist, well-drained soils. Closely related to sugar maple, used in sap production. Large tree, moderate growth.	◐◑	6-12"	\$10.00	\$17.00	\$34.00
Box Elder	<i>Acer negundo</i> . Tolerant of most soils. Widely planted and fast growing. Sometimes used in erosion control. Decorative wood.	○	12-18"	\$7.00	\$11.00	\$23.00
Bur Oak	<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i> . Moist to dry soil. Clay tolerant. Slow growing. Large acorns. Wood is similar to white oak.	○	12-18"	\$7.00	\$11.00	\$23.00

Red Maple	<i>Acer rubrum</i> . Tall, fast growing tree. Beautiful fall foliage. It can be found growing in swamps, on poor, dry soils, and almost anywhere in between.	◐	18-24"	\$11.00	\$19.00	\$38.00

Black Chokeberry	<i>Aronia melanocarpa</i> . Acidic, moist to wet soils. Reliable, thicket forming.	◐	12-18"	\$8.00	\$14.00	\$29.00

Evan's Bali Cherry	Standard rootstock. Self-fertile, dark red fruit, good for eating and baking; a very sweet tart cherry. Zone 3 \$70 for each Cherry tree. 2 or more for \$65.00 each.					
Frostbite™ Apple	Semi-dwarf rootstock. Maroon colored, small to medium fruit. Sweet, firm, short storage. Zone 3					\$60 for each apple tree. Pick 2 or more for \$55.00 each.
Haralred® Apple	Semi-dwarf rootstock. Red colored, medium to large fruit. Firm and tart. Zone 3					
Red Duchess Apple	Standard rootstock. Red and green colored fruit. Buttery flavor, sweet and tart, long storage. Zone 4.					
Wodarz Apple	Standard rootstock. Red, yellow, and green colored fruit. Good for eating and storage. Zone 3.					
Zestar!® Apple	Standard rootstock. Crisp apple with sweet-tart flavor. Excellent for fresh eating and cooking. Blooms early with late August fruit. Zone 3.

Boyne Red Raspberries	Summer bearing. Heavy producer ripens early. Zone 3.	\$10.00 each. Pick 5 or more for \$9.00 each
Killarney Red Raspberries	Summer bearing. Cold hardy and reliable. Zone 3.	
Bluecrop Blueberries	Sweet, ripens early. Robust plants. Good for commercial operations like u-pick and mechanical harvest. Zone 4.	
Rancocas Blueberries	Very strong blueberry flavor, excellent for pie & muffins, ripens early. Zone 4.

Canada Red Rhubarb	Tender, sweet, red, and winter hardy. Prefers moist well drained soil. Zone 3	\$13 Each 2 or more \$12 each
Crimson Red Rhubarb	Sweet and tart, red, and winter hardy. Very disease resistant. Zone 3	
Viking Asparagus (Bundle of 10)	Heirloom variety. Hardy, rust resistance produces good yields and is open pollinated. Zone 4.	\$18 each 2 or more \$15 each
