101			Cortland Apple	Red/Green, juicy & crispy, firm, good for eating, cooking, and baking. Zone 4
102			Frostbite Apple	Maroon color, medium fruit, late, sweet firm, short storage, rich molasses flavor, Zone-3
103			Honeycrisp Apple	Yellow, sweet, great pollinator, short store, wonderful fresh, commercial use, Zone-4
104			Kudos Apple	Blushed red color, very crisp and juicy, sweet well balanced flavor, Zone 4
105			Liberty Apple	Dark Red, creamy flesh, organic grow friendly resistant to diseases, sweet-tart, Zone-4
106			Triumph Apple	Red fruit, firm texture, pleasant tartness and balanced flavor, good storage life. Zone 4
107			Wolf River Apple	Red/Yellow/Green, very large size, good for baking, Zone 4
108			Yellow Transparent Apple	Yellow, very productive, multi use, and old-time favorite. Zone 3
109			Zestar Apple	Red/Green, early & hardy, crisp, long storage, with a zesty brown sugar flavor, Zone 3
110			Chestnut Crabapple	Pollinator apple, white blossoms, cold hardy with a nutty taste, Zone 3
111			Luscious Pear	Juicy, sweet, medium to small bright yellow fruit. Pollen-sterile, cannot be used to pollinate a second pear tree. Ure is a good pollinator for this tree. Zone 4-8
112			Golden Spice Pear	Yellow/Blush Red, best with Ure, dense tree needs full sun, canning & spicing, Zone-3
113			Ure Pear	Best w/Early Gold-Golden Spice-Patten-Parker, hardy, small fruit, fresh or can, Zone-3/2
114			Pipestone Plum	Red, sweet, juicy, yellow flesh, large fruit, fresh, jam, productive, peels easy, Zone-3
115			Toka Plum	Self-fertile & pollinate, juicy plums, yellow flesh, sweet & hardy, Zone-3
116			Evans Bali Cherry	Self-fertile, Dark Red, blooms white, eat-bake, lovely sweet tart cherry, Zone-3
117			Sweet Cherry Pie	Self-fertile, Red, very sweet pie cherry, heavy crop yield, jam, jelly, pie, Zone-4

119			Strawberry-Sparkle (Zone 3)	JUNE- Midseason, medium size berry, dark red, excellent flavor, 1x1x1 foot area per
120			Blueberry-Bluecrop (Zone 4)	Sweet & early, great for U-pick or commercial mechanical harvest, highbush, 6x6x6 area
121			Blueberry-Northland (Zone 3)	Very hardy, cross of highbush & lowbush, low stature, productive, 5x5x3 foot area
122			Blueberry-Patriot (Zone 3)	Large berries, early season, good flavor, multi-use, orange leaves fall, 3x3x5 foot area
123			Darrow Blackberry (Zone 3)	Very hardy, productive, tasty, upright, strong canes w/thorns, 3x3x3 foot area
124			Latham Red Raspberry (Zone 3)	Junebearing - Ripens early June, sweet fruit, pure red, firm, 2x2x5 foot area
125			Anne Yellow Raspberry (Zone 4)	Everbearing. Large, firm, golden berries, ripens in July, self-pollinating, hardy
126			Rhubarb-Canada Red (Zone 3)	Tender, sweet, Red w/Green leaves, winter hardy, moist, well-drained soil, 3x3x4 area
127			Rhubarb-Crimson Red (Zone 2/3)	Sweet yet tart, Red w/Green leaves, winter hardy, very disease resistant, 3x3x3 area
128			Asparagus-Millennium (Zone 3)	Good for a range of soils including clay, good for freezing
129			Asparagus-Jersey Giant (Zone 3)	Early, high yields, disease resistant, superb spears

138			Chokeberry-Black	Grows to 5-8', wildlife, birds, people, jam, jelly, likes shade and wet sites
139			Cranberry-Highbush	Grows to 8-15', birds & most animals, many soils & likes water
140			Dogwood-Red Osier	Grows to 3-15', eye-catching, birds and pollinators, moist soils
141			Elderberry-Black	Grows 5-10', wildlife, people, jelly, wine, medicinal plant, likes forest edges
142			Hazelnut-American	Grows to 6-15', grouse, moose, most animals, rich-moist soils
143			Holly-Winterberry	Grows to 3-10', likes acidic soil, for birds, toxic to people/dogs
144			Mountain Ash/Rowen	Grows to 10-30', most animals, easy to grow, most soils, pretty
145			Mulberry-Red	Grows 30-50', all animals, birds, bees, people, fruit, jam, good for poor soils
146			Pasture Rose	Small perennial shrub, 18 to 40 inches, grows in a variety of sites and soil conditions
147			Plum-American	Grows to 10-30', animals, erosion control, most soils, hardy
148			Serviceberry-Downy	Grows to 10-20', animals, likes openings, many soils, does not like contaminated soils
149			Thimbleberry	Grows up to 8', large dense spreading shrub, large leaves, delicate sweet/tart red berries
150			Washington Hawthorn	Grows to 32', small red berry like fruit good for birds and other wildlife

ITEM#	QTY	TOTAL	BAREROOT DECIDUOUS TREES	
151			Birch-Paper	Classic birch tree, common in the boreal forest, relatively fast growing and short lived
152			Birch-River	Liked by birds, deer, hummingbirds, does well in wetlands, riverbanks, and moist soil
153			Birch-Yellow	Browsed by deer, grouse, moose, songbirds, good with hemlock, bad with sugar maple
154			Maple-Red	Likes well drained soil, but can tolerate moist conditions. Grows quickly.
155			Maple-Silver	Grows quickly, erosion control, likes water, weak wood, wildlife, red fall foliage
156			Maple-Sugar	10-year-old tree typically 20', shade tolerant, variety of soil conditions
157			Oak-Bur	Large acorns good for wildlife, deer, tolerates many soils, can handle drought, full sun
158			Oak-Red Oak	Preferes well drained soils, tolerant of a wide variety of soils, does best in full sun
159			Oak-Swamp White	Likes sun, good acorns for wildlife can tolerate acidic moist soils, well-drained soils
160			Oak-White	Can grow very large with huge canopy if grown in the open. Ideal shade tree.
161			Tulip Poplar	Hardy in zone 4, fast growing with strong wood, very large, popular specimen tree

163			Grow Tubes (Corrugated Plastic) 5'	Protect seedlings from herbivores and act like a mini greenhouse to encourage growth.
164			5 Pack Vinyl Tree Wraps 36"	Protects bark on trees from winter and pest damage.
165			6' Bamboo Stake	Use in the garden, provide extra support for small seedlings, use with tree tubes
166			Rooting Gel, 2oz	Mix into potting or planting soil to increase the soil's water-holding capacity
